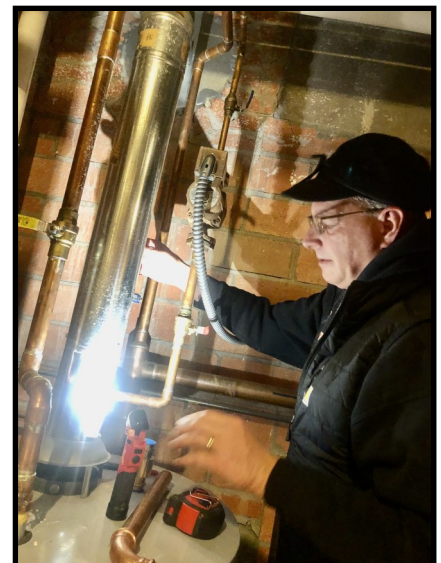
-- Railing Installation

Our Wyoming Councils have been as active and vibrant this year as of any of the last 100 years that Wyoming has had Knight of Columbus Councils. It is truly exciting to be part of a Brotherhood in which we share common beliefs and excitement for our Faith. We do this through our Council activities based in our Faith in Action.

The Faith in Action program sections have given you a guide for using and demonstrating those time-honored gifts of Charity, Unity and Fraternity. First and foremost, the Council completed activities needs to be told in the reports you submit for the Columbian Awards Application (#SP-7). You will find that form and the others that I will reference throughout this letter listed below.

You now also have the opportunity to submit your Council's activities to the State for consideration for the State Awards. As you fill out those award forms, use the **FAITH IN ACTION guidebook** from the Supreme website as a guide. The **Fraternal Programs Report Form** will also help guide you through the process.

Once you have completed that process, please do us the honor of submitting your single best program or activity **in each of the four (4) categories: Faith, Family, Community, and Life** to the State Council for judging **before** the Wyoming State Convention being held in Cheyenne, April 26th through the 28th.

Award nominations are due to April 12th!

The Form **State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form (#STSP)** is the proper way to submit each of these entries for four categories. You are also encouraged to submit **Wyoming State Family of the Year (form #10680)** and the **Wyoming State Knight of the Year** (no form as it is a State Program). The links for the forms are listed below.

For the 2nd straight year the Knights are accepting the **State Blessed Michael McGivney Award** (form #SBMMA). A matter of courtesy and protocol it would probably be best to obtain the Priest's permission to nominate him.

We need to have the entries in early to judge the **Faith, Family, Community and Life** entries plus the **Wyoming State Family of the Year** and the **Wyoming State Knight of the Year**.

The Past State Deputies will conduct an on-line review and judging as we did last year. We found that the ability to see, read, and review the submissions with more time was beneficial. In the past when having to do these on an early Friday morning, many times we ran into and over some of the opening ceremonies at the Convention. Please note again the due date is April 12th.

FEBRUARY 2024 MARKET INSIGHTS

For the month of January, the stock market, as measured by the S&P 500, returned 1.7%¹. The equity market has been watching the Fed very closely for clues on when the Federal Reserve might want to start cutting the Federal Funds rate. The more recent inflation and wage data has not been as constructive for rate cuts so we will need to pay close attention to earnings to see if equities can propel higher from this level. Early earnings reports have shown some weakness thus the stock market strength since November has been significantly driven by expected rate cuts by the Fed.

The bond market, as measured by the Bloomberg Aggregate Bond Index, returned -0.3% for the month¹. It was an active month in fixed income. While the 10-year Treasury yield increased by 3 basis points, ending January at a yield of 3.91%, we saw a high of 4.18% and a low of 3.88%¹. The 2-year Treasury declined by 4 basis points and ended the month at a yield of 4.21%¹. The market has been very focused on the shape of the yield curve which at one point in 2023, saw the yield of the 2-year Treasury over 100 basis points higher than the 10-year Treasury. Historically, an inverted yield curve has portended a recession. More recently, the spread between 2-year and 10-year Treasury issues has increased by 7 basis points to about -30 basis points¹. The 2-year to 10-year yield spread narrowed to a low of -17 basis points and was as wide as -42 basis

points¹. Does the lessening of the yield curve inversion mean that a recession is off the table? We do not think that this is the case, but a movement to a flatter curve may lead to a less severe recession if one occurs.

As we look at other economic indicators, oil was up nearly \$5.50 per barrel during the month to \$75.85 and hit a high during the month of over \$781. The continued unrest in the Middle East due to the continued fighting in Gaza and the aggressive activities of the Houthi rebels are all adding into the upward pressure on the price of oil. Inflation continues to be an issue as headline inflation grew by 3.4% year-over-year and grew by 3.9% when food and energy are factored out of the equation¹. Unemployment stood at 3.7% in January and hourly earnings are increasing at an annual rate of 4.5%¹. Economic activity continues to show strength with Factory Orders increasing by 0.2%, Durable Goods flat month over month, Industrial Production up 0.1% from the previous month, and the S&P 500 manufacturing PMI was 50.7, indicating expansion in the manufacturing sector¹. Finally, the Index of Leading Indicators was down 0.1%, continuing to indicate a coming slowdown in economic activity¹.

What does all of this mean? When we look at the continued strength in the employment market and wages that are growing in excess of inflation, it may be difficult for the Fed to start cutting rates. The Fed has a mandate to control inflation and to keep the economy at maximum employment. By any measure, an unemployment rate of 3.7% illustrates very little slack in the labor market. This is certainly part of the explanation for wages growing at 4.5% over the trailing 12 months. We continue to believe that the Fed is most focused on slowing inflation so we could see the Fed either pause on the start of a rate cutting cycle and, in the extreme, be forced to tighten fiscal policy even further. We believe the next releases of inflation data will be key, particularly on the heels of the recent release of job creation and wage growth statistics.

Beyond our economic issues, we need to remain focused on the continued fighting in Ukraine. As we



have discussed previously, Putin wants Ukrainian territory to end fighting and Ukraine wants the Russians and their proxies out of Ukraine. It appears that the European Union may be ready to fund Ukraine for an additional 50 billion euros in military aid. Recent reports have indicated that Ukraine is in need of ammunition and other munitions to keep up their fight. Part of the mess is that Russia wants to claim territory that they only believe they are entitled to, and while the world is growing weary of funding this war, questions of corruption over all of the aid that has flowed into Ukraine since the start of the conflict are mounting.

The unrest in the Middle East is also a significant issue facing the world. After Hamas murdered innocent Israelis, Israel struck into Gaza with a goal of the eradication and destruction of Hamas. In the meantime, Hezbollah and Houthi rebels have been active. Hezbollah has fired rockets into Israel and the Houthis have been wreaking havoc by firing on cargo and oil vessels. The U.S. has been bombing Houthi weapon caches and the USS Carney has been actively intercepting a number of Houthi fired rockets. Iran has been posturing that they do not want war and the activity is solely the Houthis, however,

we view this as a pretty thin argument given that the Iranians are the financial supporter for the Houthis. The destabilizing impact of this fighting is the concern, particularly if the fighting grows to encompass the entire region and other countries.

Finally, the Presidential election season is fully upon us. The Republican side is really down to two viable candidates: Donald Trump and Nikki Haley. It is interesting that recent polls show that Trump and Biden are in a statistical dead heat, however, Nikki Haley leads Biden. Such is the state of play, as Haley might have a better chance of beating Biden in a national election across partisan and independent voters, but she may not be able to win her own party's nomination. We also think there could be a late switch for President Biden given widely accepted views on his cognitive decline. There are more miles to cover and more twists and turns before final nominations. The unsettled nature of this election may add to market volatility.

Other than all of this, there is not much going on! Until next month.

Knights of Columbus Unified Participation in the National Eucharistic Revival

The Eucharist is the source and summit in the life of a Knight.

*The more we devote ourselves to the Eucharist,

The Bishops of the United States have invited all US Catholics to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. As Knights, we should respond to this call for a National Eucharistic Revival, which “...is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery... by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist” (eucharisticrevival.org).

We encourage all Knights to find ways to participate in this revival – individually, as a local council, and at the state level.

Below are some of our recommendations for this year as we prepare for the National Eucharistic Congress.

INDIVIDUAL KNIGHTS

- ▣ **Sacrifice for Our Lord and the Revival:** Abstain from meat on Fridays as a form of penance, prayer and devotion.
- ▣ **Pray with Our Lady:** Pray the Rosary the 12th of each month (in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe 12/12 and Blessed McGivney’s birthday 8/12) for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- ▣ **Prepare your heart:** Arrive 10-15 minutes early to each Mass to contemplate Jesus’ gift of himself.
- ▣ **Give thanks:** Offer 5 minutes of prayerful praise after each Mass and pray the Anima Christi.
- ▣ **Be with Our Lord:** Spend 30 extra minutes every week outside of Mass sitting or kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament.
- ▣ **Attend Daily Mass:** On days you cannot, make an act of Spiritual Communion.
- ▣ **Pray for the gift of the Spirit during the National Eucharistic Procession:** Starting May 10, 2024, pray the Novena to Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost and start of National Eucharistic Procession (May 17th) Learn more about the National Eucharistic Procession at www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.
- ▣ **Unite with fellow Catholics:** Register for the National Eucharistic Congress and encourage others to join you! (July 17–21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana.) Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: **knights**.



LOCAL COUNCILS

- ▣ **Pray together:** Each month, invite members to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- ▣ **Adore and reconcile with Our Lord:** Organize the Holy Hour Program with the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
 - ▣ **Encourage parish participation:** Share the Knights of Columbus Eucharistic Revival & Eucharistic Procession materials with your pastor/chaplain and offer to assist him in promoting Adoration and coordinating a Eucharistic Procession (www.kofc.org/eucharist).
- ▣ **Unite at the Congress:** Talk to your pastor to see if your parish will be represented at the National Eucharistic Congress. Register as a group from your parish/council for the National Eucharistic Congress (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana). Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: **knights**.
- ▣ **Revival in your Council Meeting:** Invite your council lecturer or another speaker to present on topics related to the Eucharist.

STATE COUNCILS

- ▣ **Promote fraternal prayer:** Send monthly reminders to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- ▣ **Provide encouragement:** State deputies could encourage participation in the Holy Hour program by local councils.
- ▣ **Organize diocesan or statewide devotion:** Request, plan, and manage a diocesan or statewide Eucharistic Procession. Invite all Catholics through councils, parishes, and, when possible, diocesan offices. For Eucharistic Procession guides and resources visit kofc.org/eucharist

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

FEBRUARY 2024

Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." (Gospel for Feb. 25, Mk 9:7)

What dispositions and virtues should you foster within yourself in order to become more open and responsive to what Christ is telling you?
