WYOMING STATE MEMBERSHIP AND SAFE ENVIRONMENT REPORT APRIL 2022

We are finishing the year very strong again as far as our membership recruiting is concerned. Our councils struggled coming out of the gate. At our winter meeting in December, we reported 8 new members with only 6 councils reporting new members. Our circle of honor report as of April 12, 2022 has Wyoming ranked at #17 out of 75 jurisdictions. We have recruited 64 new members. Our goal is 73 members, so we need to recruit 9 more to reach our goal by June 30, 2022. 14 councils (50%) have successfully recruited members.

We have had to really maintain our focus on our safe environment compliance stats. Our primary failure with compliance has been the inability to appoint personnel to all of our council's director positions. 10 councils have successfully filled all of their director positions and therefore are fully compliant with their safe environment training.

2 councils do not have a Grand Knight, 9 councils do not have a program director, 11 councils do not have a community director and 16 councils do not have a family director.

Of all the positions that are filled with qualified personnel, we have only 2 that are non-compliant. I have tried to send reminder emails to those who were scheduled for refresher training which I think really helped build our success.

I have encouraged the round tables in the past to send their reports to me and I will see that they get to Supreme. This gives me a chance to know that they have filed a report as well as Supreme.

District Deputy #2 Convention Report

District 2 had a growth spurt halfway through the fraternal year. In addition to councils 1563 and 9917 in Casper and 6558 in Douglas, Council 2128, Rawlins, and 11291, Saratoga, were annexed. I believe this is actually a rollback to years past. Fortunately, our State Treasurer, Jim Larscheid, has agreed to oversee the councils on the south end of District 2.

Council 11291, Saratoga, is leading the recruitment charge, having attained 400% of goal so far this year. They are a very small, but active, council that is obviously valued by their pastor. I feel that good things will continue to happen there. Momentum and integrity will pay off.

Council 1563, Casper, has taken on a leadership role in the Casper March for Life. To begin with, they provided a site and partnered with Natrona For Life. Now they have become the driving force behind the event that annually involves over a hundred participants marching through downtown Casper. Membership quota is at 40% with more candidates in the wings.

Council 9917, also Casper, was tasked with coming up with a solution for one of our brothers in need. A long-time and third generation member of our council were faced with a diagnosis of cancer of their young child. Having treatments in Denver while caring for their 6 other children left them with some life challenges ahead of them. So, along with our annual St. Patrick's dinner, 9917 ran a fundraiser for our family and raised over \$20,000 that evening. People's kindness prevailed. 9917 is at 40% of membership quota with another 40% to be initiated in the near future.

All three of these councils participate in the RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) Program. I applaud them for continuing to support our seminarians.

Council 2128, Rawlins, is not very active. There is hope, with one or two members interested in at least keeping the council out of suspension. With patience, that spark will continue to grow so they can exist, even if on a minimum level.

Council 6558, Douglas, is in a dire situation. Their search for a Financial Secretary has been unsuccessful. Their slate of officers remains incomplete. They are currently facing suspension by Supreme. I am working to get them paid up to the point that we can avoid that suspension.

This is just a snapshot of the things that councils in District 2 are doing. All of these councils are full of good Catholic men of integrity that I am proud to be associated with. God is good.

We had an online District Meeting back in January to address the changes in the Order. We identified the differences in those programs and why the changes were made. We talked about ideas to bring a fresh start to the Councils and the parishes by using the Knights of Columbus programs to place their Faith in Action. As District Deputy I enjoy the involvement with the State Council and I enjoy interacting with the Parish Councils. I am extremely proud of the councils in District 3, and I am excited to identify and pursue each of the opportunities that will present themselves during this coming year. Vivat Jesus!

This last year we provided some funds for RSVP of 3 seminarians.

We provided \$500 scholarships for three, first year college students.

Fruit baskets were give to widows of KofC members at Christmas time.

We contributed \$500 to the KofC Ukraine fund.

We donated \$350 to the parish library, for the purchase of children's faith books.

At Christmas time, the book "Life Is Messy", was passed out to parishioners at Mass at the churches in Torrington, Guernsey and Lusk.

An All-Saints Party was hosted for the children, as was a "Keep Christ in Christmas" poster activity.

Council 6623 hosted two of the Friday Lenten suppers this year.

This year we were able to resume our Pro-Life Breakfast fundraiser and served 125 people.

We donated \$2,000 to the Goshen County RTL.

And we also contributed \$500 toward the replacement of a Pro-Life sign on U.S. 26, between Torrington and Morrill, NE.

We held a Church Delta Drive, and had an Exemplification the following week, in the church, where we brought in an online member.

Parishioners were able to witness the Exemplification and found the ceremony quite moving.

We are planning to form a "Rosary Team", to lead the rosary at funeral services, thereby relieving the priest of that activity.

And recently, we have been meeting with Father Dan, ½ hour before council meetings, for faith discussions.

Worthy State Officers, Supreme Representative, Fr. Louis Shea and Brother Knights all:

Council 7453 in Green River has once again been busy in spite of continued issues with Covid 19. We have conducted two food drives for the Food For Families program, turning in over 1000 lbs. of non-perishable food to the Green River Food Bank. Once again, we conducted the Coats for Kids program with partners from TATA Chemical and The Radio Network. This program has been a huge success and helps serve needy children throughout Sweetwater County winter coats. One of our traditions at Immaculate Conception is for the Knights of Columbus to host the annual Easter Egg Hunt. We boil and dye dozens of eggs on Good Friday morning in preparation for the big event on Holy Saturday. We host a Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest each Christmas.

During the fall/winter, we shoveled one of our fellow Knights sidewalks and driveway as he has been ill with cancer. One of our Brothers delivers them communion every Saturday evening. Several Knights went to the same household to split firewood for them. Phone calls or personal visits have been conducted weekly for them.

Our Council continues to participate in the Annual Run with the Horses Marathon/Riverfest Celebration each summer. We cook spaghetti for the runners as well as the general public. Our Council rounds up food, supplies and cooks for the Parish Picnic in one of the County Parks each summer after an outdoor Mass. When Lent began, we conducted our Lenten Fish Frys on Friday nights serving breaded cod, cole slaw, baked potatoes, dinner rolls and dessert. On two occasions we served shrimp linguini and shrimp/seafood Alfredo. We also served Father Tom Sheridan's famous Irish stew on Saint Patrick's Day.

Our church does not go without help from the Knights of Columbus. We decorate the church grounds with the outdoor Manger scene and decorate all of the trees with multi-colored solar lights. Knights and their spouses help with decorating the interior of the church at Christmas and Easter. Knights are called upon to take up the collections, usher, readers and requested to lead the Rosary before Mass.

Council 7453 continue to support our Priest and a Seminarian. We participate in the RSVP program on a monthly basis for our selected Seminarian. We provide our Priest with monetary gifts at Christmas and on his birthday. We have taken our Priest to the Salt Lake Airport and back during inclement weather for trips to his homeland/business
